- The responsible person should provide documentation to Ted Ouellet, MCFN Registration Administrator
- Documentation should be **one** of the following:
 - Copy of a death certificate,
 - o Church death certificate,
 - o Original funeral director statement,
- Once documentation is received by Ted Ouellet, he will fill out the required forms, and forward documentation and forms to INAC.
- Once required documentation is received by INAC, then that person will be noted as deceased and removed from the MCFN membership list.
- Obituary notices are not accepted by INAC.

Issuing Status Cards at the Gathering

Hello, Members:

This year there will be someone to issue CIS (status) cards at the Gathering.

You must supply your own coloured picture. (1"x 1"1/2).

Make sure there is nothing on your face. No sunglasses or hats etc.

You should bring two pieces of ID:

Drivers Licence, health card, birth certificate, or your old CIS card if it has not expired for more than 6 months.

Fire arms license, provincial ID card, current student card.

Passport—counts as two pieces.

Nexus card -counts as two pieces.

If you do not have two pieces of ID, you will need to submit a guarantor's declaration.

PLEASE NOTE: If you have a SCIS (<u>Secure</u> Certificate of Indian Status) and you have lost it, you are not entitled to a paper laminated card. And you are to apply at the Toronto INAC office.

We are not issuing CIS cards to other First Nations during the Gathering.

In our Band, you need to be 18 years and over to sign your CIS card. Parents can sign for their children under 18.

Guardians can sign with proof of their custody from the courts or child services documents.

If you have any concerns, please call the office at 1-800-319-3001 before you attend the Gathering.
