We have invited Chief Lawrence Martin to do a presentation on "The Ring of Fire" to the membership. This presentation will be at the Castle Building in Echo Bay, on July 4th at 2pm.

This month was full of meetings. We met with Argonaut and one of the camp operations partners and we were successful in determining the next steps in our strategy. We met with Vital Drilling and they are very eager to continue to build a partnership.

During the Council of Chief's meeting we discussed the upcoming Mushkegowuk Elections.

I would like to remind everyone that the official MCFN Facebook group is "Missanabie Cree First Nation". Other Facebook groups may have posts that are not approved

by the Missanabie Cree Office and may contain incorrect information on various topics. Many of the other groups will have posts with an individual's personal view stated which may be based on incorrect information, hearsay or rumours.

In regards to the MCFN website, I would like to take a moment to address the members on this issue. This month our MCFN website was hacked for a second time. We were informed that the technology used for our previous website is now outdated and this is why we have been hacked for a second time. Due to the severi-

Letter from: Maurice Law

To: Chief and Council Dated: June 2, 2015

Re: Missanabie Cree First Nation at al. v. Ontario et al.

Further to my status report of April 24, 2015, I would like to bring you up to date on the current status of the TLE litigation.

I provided legal counsel for Ontario and Canada with an initial *draft* Agreed Statement of Facts on April 30, 2015.

The Case Management Conference with Madame Justice Himel, which has been scheduled for May 13, 2015, was adjourned to May 21, 2015 and proceeded on that date. As a result of that case Management Conference, Ontario and Canada agreed to provide their comment on the *draft* Agreed Statement of Facts by June 22, 2015.

The next Case Management Conference is scheduled for June 29, 2015, by which time all legal counsel are to advise Madame Justice Himel of any witnesses they intend to call at the trial of the preliminary issue and each party's estimated length of time needed for trial. An attempt will be made, at that next Case Management Conference, to set the matter down for trial.

Respecting witnesses for the trial of this preliminary issue (that is, the Crystallization Date" issue), the Plantiff Missanabie Cree First Nation will only be calling our expert, Joan Holmes, as a witness.

Whachey to all my family, extended family, friends and acquaintances of Missanabie Cree First Nation:

I would like to welcome Debbie Clement to Education and Events Coordinator and Terri Montgomery as assistant to the Events Coordinator.

May was a very quiet month for me as I did not report in

the last Bearfax. June has been and will be hopefully a more productive month.

June 3rd: We had a meeting with Craig Gideon and had discussions about invoices that were owed to Maurice Law. Through this, we heard Maurice Law will defer payment until Settlement occurs.

Met with the CEO Richard Sutcliff of Pavey Ark Minerals regarding an exploration permit for the claim in the Hawkins Project. Discussions will be ongoing.

June 4th: I was pleased with the discussions we had with the Richmont Mines; continuing discussion is needed. The meeting was continued on June 15th where we are having ongoing discussion for Missanabie Cree's future.

June 15th: Was involved in a teleconference regarding the TLE (Transfer Lands). Canada to finalize contract for consultants to complete the Environmental Site Assessment of the Transfer Lands. Site visits by consultants are expected to begin July or August, 2015. Missanabie Cree to be notified prior to site visits being undertaken.

Missanabie Cree continue talks with Michipicoten and Red Sky (Metis) with respect to shared traditional territo-

ry. We were provided with an overview of the various steps within the Addition to Reserve (ATR) process, outlining which steps have been completed and describing the future process to set the lands apart as reserve. As the updates become available, I will provide them in next Bear Fax.

Members, please do not hesitate to call, email and or Facebook message me with any concerns or questions.

May the Creator bless us all with a wonderful summer and looking forward to seeing you at our upcoming Gathering.

I believe my best days are ahead of me, not behind me.


I believe I'm here for a reason and my purpose is greater than my challenges.
